# Congress Scheduling/Student Competition

- CAP wishes to announce the divisional student awards at the banquet (and invite the students).
- They also have a run-off competition on Wednesday mornings and name a final winner on Wednesday afternoons.
- They dropped the extended abstract requirement and 40+ students are in the competition this year (about 1/2)
- Implications on scheduling: all students in competition must speak before Tuesday noon. This messes-up the “themes” of the sessions.
- Possibilities:
  - ① Program students without regard to theme (eg. Monday is student day)
  - ② Enter all students in competition, program using themes and give all awards at the end.
  - ③ Program with themes, start Sunday finish late Tuesday, early Wednesday and push student deadline to 5pm Tuesday.
