One-Year Part-time (60%) Limited Term Appointment in Physics

The Department of Chemical and Physical Sciences (<https://www.utm.utoronto.ca/cps>), at the University of Toronto Mississauga (<https://www.utm.utoronto.ca/>), invites applications for a one year, part-time (60%) Limited Term Lecturer position in the field of Physics beginning July 1, 2021, or shortly thereafter.

Candidates must have a PhD in Physics or a closely related discipline at the time of appointment or shortly thereafter with a preference for a specialization in biophysics. The successful candidate will be expected to teach three semester-long courses at the undergraduate level, mentor undergraduate students, and contribute in service roles within the department. Candidates must have a demonstrated record of excellence in teaching at the undergraduate level. We also prefer candidates with experience working with, teaching, or mentoring diverse students.

Excellence in teaching, including mastery of the subject matter and excellence in classroom teaching, may be evidenced by teaching accomplishments highlighted in the CV and cover letter, the teaching dossier (including a teaching statement, sample course materials and teaching evaluations), strong letters of reference that specifically address the candidate's qualities as a teacher and mentor, and evidence of strong communication and expository skills (as demonstrated by performance as a teaching assistant or course instructor, experience leading successful workshops or seminars, or excellent conference posters and presentations).

Equity and diversity are among UTM's core values and are essential to academic excellence. We seek candidates who value diversity and whose research, teaching and service bear out our commitment to equity. Candidates are therefore also asked to submit a one-page statement of contributions to equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) which might cover topics such as (but not limited to): research or teaching that incorporates a focus on underrepresented communities, the development of inclusive pedagogies, or the mentoring of students from underrepresented groups.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Applicants should submit a cover letter outlining their teaching experience and areas of expertise, a current curriculum vitae, a teaching dossier, and an EDI statement. Applicants should also provide the names and contact information for two referees who are familiar with the candidate's teaching qualifications and experience. Referees of the applicants who are shortlisted will be contacted directly by the department for reference letters. Applications materials (with the exception of reference letters) must be submitted via email to cps.utm@utoronto.ca. To receive full consideration, applications should be received by **April 19, 2021**.
